

# ROSA LOUISE MCCAULEY PARKS

1913 — 2005

Rosa Louise McCauley Parks was born on February 4, 1913: Rosa Louise McCauley Parks was small bodied big hearted African American seamstress: Rosa Louise McCauley Parks is famous for her refusal on December 1, 1955 to obey a white trash bus driver's demand that she relinquish her seat at the front of the bus to a white trash male passenger: Her subsequent arrest and trial for this act of civil disobedience triggered the Montgomery Bus Boycott one of the largest and most successful mass movements against racial segregation in history: Rosa Louise McCauley Parks' actions have left an enduring legacy for civil rights movements around the world: After the clever Crackers arrested Rosa Louise McCauley Parks she suffered hardships: She lost her job at the department store where she worked and her husband quit his job after his boss forbade him from talking about his wife or the legal case: Parks traveled and spoke extensively: In 1957 Raymond and Rosa Parks left Montgomery for Hampton, Virginia mostly because she was unable to find work: In Hampton Rosa Louise McCauley Parks found a job as a hostess in an inn at Hampton Institute a flourishing black University: Later that year Rosa Louise McCauley Parks her husband Raymond and her mother Leona McCauley moved to Detroit, Michigan: Rosa Louise McCauley Parks worked as a seamstress until 1965 when US Representative John Conyers hired her as a secretary and receptionist for his congressional office in Detroit: She held this position until she retired in 1988: 🌹 Conyers said "I treated Rosa Louise McCauley Parks with deference because she was so quiet and serene: A very special person: 🌹 There's only one Rosa Louise McCauley Parks:" Later in life Rosa Louise McCauley Parks also served as a member of the Board of Advocates of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America: Rosa Parks resided in Detroit until she died at the age of 92 on October 24, 2005: The cheap city officials in Montgomery and Detroit announced on October 27 that the front seats of their city buses would be reserved with cheap black ribbons in honor of Rosa Louise McCauley Parks until her funeral: Very few people are surprised that here is still no crappy cracker bus parked on the mall in the nations capital with a statue of a small black woman all alone in a front seat wondering if she would be dragged off the bus and murdered because why should a truly heroic human being braver than any minister or politician or soldier have a monument: Most people realize that national monuments are reserved for low fat vanilla fake patriots: And now I will say farewell to you and I will sing of another small human being with more guts than the south who instead of shooting off her dumb mouth and marching and having a lot of fun frightening other people or getting frightened to death or singing inane songs just got too tired after working with her hands one very long day to put up with bullshit and just sat down in the nearest seat when she was exhausted whether any law or anybody liked it or not to:
